Soft Start

The 'Soft Start' has been working well over the past week and most pupils are organised and ready for learning by 9am. Could we remind you that doors will open at 8.45am and the entrances are at the Primary 1 door and the main office. There will always be a member of staff at these points and staff throughout the school.

Uniform

The pupils have all looked resplendent in their uniform since the start of term. Could we remind you put your child's name on every piece of clothing as this will make it easier to return lost items. Children are expected to have a change of shoes for inside use, such as a pair of plimsolls.

Mr Harkins has also asked me to remind you about PE kit. Indoor kit should be a plain white t-shirt and plain black shorts. Plimsolls can be worn, but trainers can also be worn as some classes may take place outside, weather permitting.

Could we also ask that you check that the clothes that come home do belong to your child, especially in the younger classes. If they belong to someone else please return them to the class teacher.

Earrings

A number of parents have asked about earrings and whether pupils are able to cover them up or keep them in during PE. Unfortunately East Dunbartonshire guidance does not allow children take part in PE whilst wearing earrings or cover them up using a plaster. All earrings must be removed as well as all other jewellery.

Parking

Parking at the start of the school day, at 3pm and during evening events can be a potential issue in the areas surrounding the school. Could we ask that you park with consideration for local residents and pedestrians and adhere to 'no parking' areas. Can we also remind you that there is also no pick up/drop off allowed in the school car parks (upper and lower), except for permitted vehicles.

The school have invested in 'Reading Cloud' which allows us to manage the distribution of books within the school. A further benefit is the availability of e-books for all of pupils which can be read on a number of platforms; Apple, Android, phone or tablet. There are not only fiction and nonfiction books form popular authors, but also a wide range of books to support cross curricular learning.

Pupils from P2-7 will be given a username and password sticker which will be placed in the Homework Diary. This will enable them to log in to the site and download books. Primary 1 will be given their passwords later in the term.

Could we please encourage you to try this resource as we will be looking for feedback later in the year on its functionality and popularity. Below you will find a step by step guide for opening the e-book.

- Go to www.readingcloud.net
- Click on **Login** at top right corner
- Type in username (3 or 4 digit number)
- Type in password
- Under the school section type in G66 and choose Holy Family from the drop down
- Click on <u>search</u> at the top of the page under the heading Reading Cloud.
- Click on the icon **eBooks.**
- Choose any book from the list as long as the words override Eresource are in the bracket after the title.
- Click on the book you want to read. When it loads onto a new page click **Open eBook** and you can start reading!
