
We aim to:

| Solidarity (Together we make a difference) | Fairtrade Snacks encouraged to stand in solidarity with those who are poor, persecuted or struggling. |
| Rights and Responsibilities (With rights come responsibilities) | Primary 5 pupils share their learning, showing that the Gospel Values are reflected in the Convention for the Rights of the Child. |
| Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers (Work is our contribution to the world) | Pupils learn that in preparation for the world of work, their school work must be approached in a responsible way. |
